Key Articles of a Constitution (10 Elements) (Model based on Maa-Nult Treaty Examples)

1. Preamble

- Declaration of identity, rights and values; describes what makes the First Nations unique
- Describes in general the people, and the territory/area of jurisdiction
- We, the people....
- 2. Individual Rights and Freedoms
- Describes and protects the rights of individuals in the community
- Describes citizenship and membership
- 3. Government Structure
- Describes the institutions of government, their powers and mandates
- May have one or more branches (i.e. a legislative branch, an executive branch, a judicial branch, a peoples assembly) or committees
- Describes election process and development of an Elections Act
- 4. Legislative Authority
- Describes the laws and law making process
- 5. The Land System
- Describes rights of individual citizens and Nation to lands
- Describes the power of the legislative authority to administer, regulate, expropriate and grant interests
- 6. Financial Administration and Accountability
- Describes financial administration laws
- Describes budget and auditing process
- May establish a Committee on Finance and rules of procedures
- 7. Code of Conduct and Conflict of Interest
- Describes code of conduct and conflict of interest guidelines of elected and non-elected representatives, and all employees of the Nation
- 8. Dispute Resolution
- Describes dispute resolution laws, processes and procedures
- 9. Approval/Ratification of Constitution
- Describes process for ratification of the constitution
- 10. Constitutional Amendments
- Describes the process to amend the constitution
